Gigondas Le Pas de l'Aigle 2021

Enormously deep nose of wild blackberries and herbs with a fascinating balsamic element. Gigantic energy and drive on the extremely focused, full-bodied palate. Very chalky tannins are married to intense licorice character in the imposing finish. Picked on October 20 from north-facing vineyards 500 meters above sea level. A pure grenache that was matured for two years in foudre casks. Drinkable now, but best from 2025.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2022

This excellent Gigondas marries rich forest berry aromas with elegant tannins and an impressive freshness on the full-bodied palate. The chalky character builds at the long, moderately firm finish. Partly from 70-year-old vines, the remainder from 50-year-old vines, all at 350 to 400 meters above sea level. A cuvee of 80% grenache matured in foudres and 20% syrah matured in barriques. Unfiltered. Drinkable now, but best from 2025.

Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane 2022

This has the full body, concentration and spicy complexity that we expect from this appellation. Excellent interplay of elderberry fruit with licorice, wild herb and chocolate character and powerful but plush tannins. Bold but polished finish. A cuvee of 60% grenache, 25% mourvedre (all whole cluster) and 15% syrah, the older vines planted during the 1950s. Bottled unfiltered. This should age very well. Drink or hold.

Cairanne Les Hautes Rives 2022

Stacks of ripe blackberry and blueberry fruit, but bright and fresh, the full-bodied palate well anchored by the firm, healthy, moderately dry tannins. A cuvee of 60% grenache, 25% mourvedre and 15% syrah from north- and west-facing high-altitude vineyards. Drink or hold.

Gigondas Romane Machotte blanc 2023

Lovely lemony freshness with everything from blossoms to candied fruit. Very attractive interplay of restrained creaminess and elegant acidity, with a touch of chalky tannins that build nicely at the finish. The first vintage of this wine. A cuvee of 70% clairette matured in amphorae and neutral oak barriques, with 25% marsanne and roussanne plus 5% viognier that were all vinified in stainless steel. All from organically grown grapes. Drink or hold.

Côtes-du-Rhône Roulepierre rouge 2022

A prototypical Cotes-du-Rhone with plenty of red fruit, candied orange and spicy aromas. Generous fruit on the medium to full-bodied palate plus a good quantity of supple tannins. Long, moderately dry finish. A cuvee of 80% grenache and 20% syrah. Drink now.

IGP Méditerranée Viognier Clairette 2023

Very aromatic with stacks of peachy fruit plus notes of oranges and lemon blossoms. Juicy and lively with a positive touch of citrus peel bitterness that accentuates the freshness at the finish. Just 12.5% alcohol. From organically grown grapes. Vinified entirely in stainless steel. Drink now.

Côtes-du-Rhône Roulepierre white 2023

Very floral and fresh on the nose for this appellation, with stacks of lemon blossoms and some white peaches. Medium to full-bodied palate, with the creaminess we associate with Cotes-du-Rhone, then plenty of candied lemon freshness at the uplifting finish. A cuvee based on 60% clairette, the rest grenache blanc with a touch of viognier grown on sandy soil. A mix of organic estate fruit and non-organic purchased grapes. Drink now.

Gigondas Le Pas de l'Aigle 2022

The pale-ruby-colored 2022 Gigondas Le Pas de l'Aigle is medium to full-bodied, savory and complex. Blending 90% Grenache with 10% Syrah, it will mature for two years foudres, with an additional year in bottle ahead of commercial release. This will be necessary, as the firm tannic structure requires times to mellow. Nonetheless, the aromas and flavors already show quite well, including a mingling spice box, strawberry, raspberry, black cherry graphite and a menthol splash.

Gigondas Le Pas de l'Aigle 2021

The 2021 Gigondas Le Pas de l'Aigle doesn't reach the same heights as the 2022. Nonetheless, it is a fabulous result in this challenging 2021 vintage. Clocking in at 15% alcohol, it bursts with fragrant licorice, raspberry jam and black jerry aromatics peppery and minty layers add more complexity. Medium to full bodied and juicy, the 2021 Le Pas de l'Aigle delivers solid flavor concentration and a resonating finish.

Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane 2022

The 2022 Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane will spend 18 months in a combination of french oak barriques (15% new) and old oak foudres. Grippy tannins provide good structure yet demand at least two more years in bottle. Ripe forest strawberry, black cherry, dried herbs and elements of mint nestle underneath firm tannins. Provided everything comes togheter as it should, this will be a fine Gigondas.

Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane 2021

The 2021 Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane is classy and structured. A blend of 65% grenache, 20% Mourvèdre and 15% Syrah, it opens with moderately intense aromas of clove, red fruit, dried herbs and menthol. Medium to full-bodied and concluding with a sapid finish. It possesses firm tannins that shoud loosen up nicely after one more year in bottle.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2022

The 2022 Gigondas Romane Machotte mixes 80% Grenache with 20% Syrah. Red fruit aromatics and nuances of pencil shavings rise up from the glass. Minly and spicy undertones add more complexity. Classic and elegant, this uplifting 2022 wraps it up with spot-on balance and a juicy core of red fruit.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2021

The 2021 Gigondas Romane was cropped at 25 hL/Ha. It goes througt twenty-one days of fermentation and maceration in concrete, leading to one year of foudre and barrique aging. The result is a slightly reductive red that gradually releases red fruit aromas, licorice traces and subtle dried herbs. Medium-bodied and well balanced, enjoy this refreshing offering over the next couple of years.

Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle 2022

93-95/100

I'd put the 2022 Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle up with the crème de la crème of the vintage. Based on 90% Grenache and 10% Syrah that will spend two years in foudre, it has remarkable purity in its ripe redcurrant and strawberry-driven fruit profile as well as complex notes of Provençal spices, crushed stone, and dried flowers. It's medium to full-bodied, beautifully balanced, has fine tannins, and a great finish.

Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle 2021 93/100

The flagship release from this terrific estate, the 2021 Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle is almost all Grenache (there is 10% Syrah) that sees a longer élevage in foudre. This beauty has a gorgeous nose of ripe black raspberries, blackberries, sandalwood, and Provençal garrigue. While it plays in the more medium-bodied, fresher style of the vintage, it has terrific mid-palate depth, ripe, polished tannins, and a great finish. The 2021 vintage in Gigondas doesn't get much better, and this has tons of appeal today yet will evolve nicely for a solid decade.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2022

88-90/100

A medium-bodied, charming, elegant Gigondas based on 80% Grenache and 20% Syrah, the 2022 Gigondas Romane Machotte has ample red fruit, some peppery, Provençal garrigue-like aromatics, ripe tannins, and a good finish. It's well-made and incredibly satisfying. Drink bottles on release and over the following 7-8 years.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2021 88/100

Based on 80% Grenache and 20% Syrah brought up in foudre and used oak, the 2021 Gigondas Romane Machotte has a forward, charming, Provençal style as well as lots of red and black fruits, peppery herb, and saddle leather-like aromas and flavors. It's medium-bodied, balanced, and thoroughly enjoyable. Drink bottles over the coming 4-6 years.

Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane 2022 91-93/100

A fruit-loaded, up-front, impressively concentrated and textured Gigondas, the 2022 Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane (65% Grenache, 20% Mourvèdre, and 15% Syrah) is medium to full-bodied, has soft, integrated tannins, no hard edges, and a great finish. I don't think it's going to be the longest lived Gigondas, but it should shine right out of the gate.

Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane 2021 90/100

The 2021 Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane is always solid. Based on 65% Grenache, 20% Mourvèdre, and 15% Syrah, it has attractive red and black fruits, some spicy wood, leather, and Provençal garrigue aromatics, medium body, sweet tannins, and a good finish. It's a pleasure-bent, textured, outstanding 2021 Gigondas to drink over the coming 5-7 years.

Vacqueyras La Grangelière 2022

I always enjoy this cuvée, and the 2022 Vacqueyras La Grangelière is a terrific value that readers will love as a house red. Perfumed red and black fruits, sappy flowers, and pretty garrigue and herbal, peppery notes all flow to a medium-bodied, fruit-loaded, charming 2022 that's perfect for drinking over the coming 3-5 years or so.

Côtes-du-Rhône Grande Réserve 2021

Very expressive nose of black cherries and ripe raspberries with a touch of something animal. This is concentrated and structured on the widescreen palate. So much drive and depth at the bold, but moderately dry finish. A cuvee of grenache and syrah matured in large oak foudres. Drink or hold.

Cairanne Les Hautes Rives 2021

This excellent red Rhone provides a good argument in favor of taking the rather new appellation of Cairanne seriously. In spite of the cooler vintage this has very good ripeness married to a floral delicacy with elegant tannins that, together with the stony acidity, give this a lot of good energy. Should age well. Drink or hold.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2021

A generous and very polished red, with lush layers of red cherry compote, boysenberry, licorice and violets. Polished and voluptuous on the creamy palate, with tarragon notes. Well-built with fine-grained tannins and graphite driving the long, svelte, cedar-kissed finish. Grenache, Mourvèdre and Syrah. Best from 2026 through 2032.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2021 91/100

Elegant and high-toned, with expressive blackberry, blueberry and smoked plum flavors laced with violet and white pepper. Delivers dusty earth, sweet tobacco and charred mesquite, which add savory dimension to the pretty profile. The persistent finish is lined with snappy acidity and fine-grained tannins. Grenache and Syrah. Drink now through 2030.

Cairanne Les Hautes Rives 2021 89/100

Elegant, with a mix of rose petal, cherry and wild strawberry backed by juicy acidity, black pepper and shaved graphite. Shows nice texture and integration, with fine-grained tannins and a thread of smoke. Grenache, Mourvèdre and Syrah. Drink now through 2027. 2,200 cases made, 350 cases imported.

Côtes du Rhône Grande Réserve 2021 89/100

Charming and fresh, with a nice mix of red cherry, currant, incense and tobacco leaf flavors. Reveals charred meat and rooibos tea notes that add detail through the succulent, mid-weight finish, which shows some chewy tannins. Grenache and Syrah. Gigondas Pas de l'Aigle 2020 93/100

A wine with a lot of soul and character, this leans slightly modern, with charred apple wood and sweet cedar nicely polishing a core of fig puree and black cherry. Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle 2018

As with most 2018s today, the 2018 Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle is up-front, charming, and drinking brilliantly. Kirsch, blackberries, toasted spices, and peppery garrigue all give way to a medium-bodied, forward, soft, and utterly delicious Gigondas to enjoy over the coming decade.

Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle 2019

Tasted out of the bottle, the 2019 Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle showed beautifully with its kirsch liqueur, blackberry, herbes de Provence, and toasted spice-driven aromas and flavors. Medium to full-bodied, pure, and seamless on the palate, it's another vintage of this cuvée that will have a lengthy, broad drink window. It should keep nicely through 2035.

Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle 2020

92-94+/100

The 2020 Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle (90% Grenache and 10% Syrah) is another gem of a wine in the making. Coming from higher elevation parcels and brought up in oak, it has an incredibly Provençal bouquet of ripe cherries, garrigue, candied flowers, and loamy earth. Medium to full-bodied on the palate, it shows the more elegant side of the vintage, has ripe tannins, and is clearly an outstanding (if not quite a bit more) wine that readers will love.

Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle 2021

92-94+/100

The flagship from this terrific estate is the 2021 Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle, which is mostly Grenache that sees a longer élevage in oak. It shows the more mid-weight style of the vintage yet has beautiful black raspberry and ripe berry fruits, medium body, good mid-palate depth, and ripe, balancing tannins. It's beautifully done, and while it will offer pleasure in its youth, this has enough structure to evolve gracefully in the cellar.

Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane 2021 89-91+/100

The 2021 Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane is 65% Grenache, 20% Mourvèdre, and the rest Syrah. It has a touch more density as well as ripe black fruits, peppery garrigue, and some meaty, leathery nuances. This ruby/purple-hued 2021 is medium to full-bodied, has rock-solid mid-palate depth, ripe tannins, and just a round, charming, delicious style that makes the most of the vintage.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2021

88-90/100

What should be a forward, charming 2021, the 2021 Gigondas Romane Machotte (80/20 Grenache and Syrah) has up-front cherry, garrigue, and peppery herb notes in a medium-bodied, nicely balanced, enjoyable package. It's going to drink nicely right out of the gate.

Vacqueyras La Grangelière 2021

89/100

A blend of 80% Grenache and 20% Syrah that was destemmed and aged in a mix of barrels and foudre, the 2021 Vacqueyras La Grangelière has a clean, fresh, lively, medium-bodied style as well as traditional notes of red berries, rose petals, peppery garrigue, and spice. It shows the fresher style of the vintage but is balanced, has good ripeness, and solid length on the finish. Enjoy bottles over the coming 7-8 years.

Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane 2021 93-95/100

Saturated ruby. Mineral- and spice-accented black and blue fruit preserve scents show sharp clarity and are complemented by suggestions of vanilla and succulent flowers. Seamless and deep in the mouth, the sweet blueberry, cherry liqueur, spicecake and candied lavender flavors are supported by a core of juicy acidity. It finished impressively long and spicy, with harmonious, slow-building tannins.

Gigondas Le Pas de L'Aigle 2021

Brilliant ruby. The expressive nose initially offers fresh red fruits and potpourri notes, which are complicated by exotic spice and incense hints. Deep but energetic, the sappy, appealingly sweet raspberry and cherry flavors tighten up through the back half. Silky tannins shape a strikingly long, pliant finish that leaves behind suave spicecake and lavender pastille notes.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2021

Opaque magenta. The fragrant note displays pungent, spice-accented red and blue fruits, potpourri, succulent herbs and baking spices. Offers densely packed yet vibrant raspberry and blueberry flavors that show fine definition and spicy lift. Supple tannins build slowly on the finish, which hangs on with strong tenacity and repeating blue fruit note.

Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane 2020 95/100

Deep, vivid ruby. A highly perfumed and finely detailed bouquet evokes fresh red berries, cherry preserves, exotic spices, candied flowers and a smoky mineral flourish. Smooth and seamless on the palate, the intense raspberry, cherry-cola, spicecake and candied lavender flavors express a compelling blend of power and delicacy. Closes smooth, gently tannic and impressively long, leaving sappy red fruit, spice and floral notes behind.

Gigondas Le Pas de L'Aigle 2020

Deep, brilliant ruby. Intensely fragrant suggestions of ripe red berries, kirsch, exotic spices and candied flowers are accompanied by a vibrant mineral nuance that builds steadily with air. Smooth and seamless in texture, the intense raspberry, cherry-cola, spicecake and lavender flavors convey a deft blend of power and delicacy. Closes smooth, gently tannic and impressively long, leaving sappy red fruit and mineral notes behind.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2020

Vivid ruby. Sharply focused cherry, blueberry, licorice and floral scents pick up hints of smoky minerals and succulent herbs with aeration. Juicy and energetic on the palate, the bitter cherry, candied licorice, expresso and lavender flavors firm up steadily through the back half. Youthfully gripping tannins sneak in late on a very long spicy finish that echoes the licorice and cherry notes.

In spite of the cooler vintage this has very good ripeness married to a floral delicacy with elegant tannins that, together with the stony acidity, give this a lot of good energy. Should age well. Drink or hold.

Gigondas Le Pas de L'Aigle 2018

Mature and rich but very dry and subtle, this is slightly old-fashioned in a delightful way. Lots of dried orange peel, dried cherry and smoke character, and behind all that the fine tannins build as the wine moves inexorably across the palate like a huge ship plowing through the ocean waves. From old grenache and syrah vines in one of the highest altitude vineyards in this appellation. Drink or hold.

Châteauneuf-du-Pape La Paillousse 2021

Generous and fleshy without any of the opulence that this appellation tends towards, this has a very attractive interplay of spice, pomegranate fruit and summer flower aromas. The solid base of rather fine tannins keep this straight and warmly dry at the long finish. Drink or hold.

Vacqueyras La Grangelière 2021

This full-bodied and fleshy Southern Rhone red has pronounced aromas of blood orange alongside the big blueberry and blackberry character, making it surprisingly lively and light on its feet. Not so long at the finish, but very drinkable. Drink now.

Côtes-du-Rhône Grande Réserve 2021

Very expressive nose of black cherries and ripe raspberries with a touch of something animal. This is concentrated and structured on the widescreen palate. So much drive and depth at the bold, but moderately dry finish. A cuvee of grenache and syrah matured in large oak foudres. Drink or hold.

A remarkably fragrant and elegant wine for this appellation with plenty of violet aromas alongside a wide spectrum of red berry aromas. So fresh and lively at the long, precise finish, it's really hard to believe that this has 14% alcohol! Drink now.

Lastly, the 2019 Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle comes from a higher elevation vineyard and is just about all Grenache that will spend two years in foudre before release. Absolutely loaded with Provençal goodness, it has sweet red and black fruits, spice, and garrigue notes to go with a medium to full-bodied, richly textured, balanced style on the palate. It's already hard to resist (even as a barrel sample) but will evolve gracefully for 15 years or more if stored properly.

Gigondas Romane Machotte 2020

The 2020 Gigondas Romane Machotte should easily be outstanding and is another high-quality wine from this producer. Pure red and black fruits, peppery herbs, and spice all flow to a medium-bodied, classy, elegant Gigondas that's very much in the style of this fresher, pure, elegant vintage.

Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane 2020

The 2020 Gigondas Domaine Grand Romane is more old-school in style and has meaty, spicy, earthy red and black fruits as well as some powerful, chewy tannins on the palate. The tannins will need to be watched, but this is a solid, possibly outstanding bottle of wine in the making. The blend is 65% Grenache, 20% Mourvèdre, and 15% Syrah brought up in very old barrels.

Gigondas Le Pas de l'Aigle 2020

The flagship 2020 Gigondas Le Pas De L'Aigle is almost exclusively Grenache (there's 10% Syrah) that sees a longer élevage in foudre. Clean red and black fruits, spice, loamy soil, and leather notes all comprise the bouquet, and it's medium to fullbodied, with a balanced, elegant mouthfeel and a great finish. It's unquestionably a beautiful wine in the making, and with its longer élevage, it normally has plenty of up-front charm as well.

Vacqueyras La Grangelière 2020

The entry level cuvée, the 2020 Vacqueyras La Grangelière is an 80/20 split of Grenache and Syrah. It has a juicy bouquet of bright berry and strawberry fruits as well as some Provençal herbs and pepper. Medium-bodied, pure, and easygoing, it's a total charmer that will drink nicely right out of the gate.
